Of the 53,674 cases, 342 were the remaining cases sentenced above the guideline range. Courts may cite multiple reasons for sentencing outside the guideline range; consequently, the total number of reasons cited generally exceeds the total number of cases. In this table, 587 reason were cited for the 342 cases, including 68 cases where the SOR was received but there was insufficient documentation provided to determine the reason. The 'Other' category includes all reasons cited fewer than five times among relevant cases. Descriptions of the variable used in this table are provided in Appendix A.
