<sup>4</sup> Effective November 1, 2012, the safety valve reduction was added to §2D1.11 (Unlawfully Distributing of Listed Chemicals). There were 156 cases sentenced under §2D1.11 as the primary sentencing guideline in which the 2012 guidelines manual was applied with complete guideline application information. Of these cases, in 61 the new safety valve reduction was applied.
