Offender and Offense Characteristics<sup>2</sup>

## Fiscal Year 2020

- IN FY 2020, 64,565 CASES WERE REPORTED TO THE U.S. SENTENCING COMMISSION.
- ▶ 37 INVOLVED COPYRIGHT AND TRADEMARK OFFENSES.<sup>1</sup>
  - COPYRIGHT AND TRADEMARK OFFENSES HAVE DECREASED BY 56.0% SINCE FY 2016.

• 70.3% were United States citizens.

•

• 81.1% had little or no prior criminal history (Criminal History Category I).

86.5% of copyright and trademark offenders were men.

51.4% were Other races, 21.6% were White, 21.6% were Black,

- The median loss for these offenses was \$178,848;<sup>3</sup>
  - 23.8% involved loss amounts of \$40,000 or less;
  - 9.5% involved loss amounts greater than \$1.5 million.
- Sentences were increased for:

and 5.4% were Hispanic.

Their average age was 42 years.

- the display, performance, publication, reproduction, or distribution of a work being prepared for commercial distribution (8.1%);
- the manufacture, importation, or uploading of infringing items or for trafficking in circumvention devices (78.4%);
- involving a counterfeit drug (5.7%);
- a leadership or supervisory role in the offense (16.2%).
- Sentences were decreased for:
  - not being committed for commercial advantage or private financial gain (2.7%);
  - minor or minimal participation in the offense (2.7%).
- The top five districts for copyright and trademark offenders were:
  - Southern District of New York (6);
  - Eastern District of Pennsylvania (5);
  - Eastern District of Kentucky (3);
  - District of New Jersey (3);
  - Eastern District of Virginia (3).

## Punishment


- The average sentence for all copyright and trademark offenders was 11 months.
- 75.7% of copyright and trademark offenders were sentenced to prison.
- None of the copyright and trademark offenders were convicted of an offense carrying a mandatory minimum penalty.




## Sentences Relative to the Guideline Range

- Of the 32.4% of copyright and trademark offenders sentenced under the Guidelines Manual:
  - 41.7% were sentenced within the guideline range.
  - 50.0% received a substantial assistance departure.
    Their average sentence reduction was 90.7%.
  - 8.3% received some other downward departure.<sup>4</sup>
- 67.6% received a variance; of those offenders:
  - 96.0% received a downward variance.
    Their average sentence reduction was 70.9%.
  - 4.0% received an upward variance.<sup>5</sup>
- The average guideline minimum slightly increased and the average sentence imposed remained steady over the past five years.
  - The average guideline minimum increased from 25 months in fiscal year 2016 to 31 months in fiscal year 2020.
  - The average sentence imposed decreased from 14 months in fiscal year 2016 to 11 months in fiscal year 2020.
