
# Fiscal Year 2021


- IN FY 2021, 57,287 CASES WERE REPORTED TO THE U.S. SENTENCING COMMISSION.
  - ▶ 17,692 CASES INVOLVED DRUGS.<sup>1</sup>
    - ▶ 17,520 INVOLVED DRUG TRAFFICKING.<sup>2</sup>
      - 10.2% OF DRUG TRAFFICKING CASES INVOLVED HEROIN.
        - HEROIN TRAFFICKING OFFENDERS HAVE DECREASED BY 33.8% SINCE FY 2017.

### Sentence Length FY 2021




# Offender and Offense Characteristics<sup>3</sup>

- 83.4% of heroin trafficking offenders were men.
- 42.1% were Hispanic, 37.6% were Black, 19.1% were White, and 1.2% were Other races.
- Their average age was 37 years.
- 84.1% were United States citizens.
- 38.8% had little or no prior criminal history (Criminal History Category I); 5.9% were career offenders (§4B1.1).
- The median base offense level in these cases was 26, corresponding to between 400 and 700 grams of heroin.
- Sentences were increased for:
  - possessing a weapon (19.1%);
  - a leadership or supervisory role in the offense (5.4%).
- Sentences were decreased for:
  - minor or minimal participation in the offense (17.4%);
  - meeting the safety valve criteria in the sentencing guidelines (33.2%).
- The top five districts for heroin trafficking offenders were:
  - Southern District of California (94);
  - District of New Jersey (86);
  - Northern District of Illinois (78);
  - Southern District of New York (70);
  - Western District of Texas (68).

## Punishment

- The average sentence for heroin trafficking offenders was 60 months.
- 95.7% were sentenced to prison.
- 58.7% were convicted of an offense carrying a mandatory minimum penalty; of those offenders, 60.7% were relieved of that penalty.



Means of Relief from Mandatory Minimum Penalty for Heroin Traffickers


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# Sentences Relative to the Guideline Range


- Of the 62.6% of heroin trafficking offenders sentenced under the • Guidelines Manual:
  - 49.4% were sentenced within the guideline range.
  - 32.5% received a substantial assistance departure. ٠ Their average sentence reduction was 57.6%.
  - 9.4% received an Early Disposition Program (EDP) departure.<sup>4</sup> Their average sentence reduction was 65.3%.
- 37.4% received a variance; of those offenders:
  - 95.9% received a downward variance.  $\diamond$  Their average sentence reduction was 43.4%.
  - 4.1% received an upward variance. Their average sentence increase was 144.4%.  $\Diamond$
- The average guideline minimum and average sentence imposed fluctuated over the past five years.
  - The average guideline minimum increased and decreased throughout the fiscal years. The average sentence was 88 months in fiscal year 2017 and 85 months in fiscal year 2021.
  - The average sentence imposed increased and decreased throughout the fiscal years. The average sentence was 65 months in fiscal year 2017 and 60 months in fiscal year 2021.




