Oxycodone Trafficking Offenses


## Fiscal Year 2020

- ► IN FY 2020, 64,565 CASES WERE REPORTED TO THE U.S. SENTENCING COMMISSION.
  - ▶ 16,501 CASES INVOLVED DRUGS.¹
    - ▶ 16,287 CASES INVOLVED DRUG TRAFFICKING.<sup>2</sup>
      - ▶ 1.8% OF DRUG TRAFFICKING CASES INVOLVED OXYCODONE.
        - ► OXYCODONE TRAFFICKING OFFENDERS HAVE DECREASED BY 47.5% SINCE FY 2016.

### Offender and Offense Characteristics<sup>3</sup>

- 73.5% of oxycodone trafficking offenders were men.
- 41.5 % of oxycodone trafficking offenders were Black, 38.3% were White, 10.1% were Hispanic, and 10.1% were Other races.
- Their average age was 45 years.
- 97.6% were United States citizens.
- 60.6% had little or no prior criminal history (Criminal History Category I); 2.1% were Career Offenders (§4B1.1).
- The median Base Offense Level in these cases was 24, corresponding to between 498 and 1,990 30-milligram instant release pills of oxycodone.
- Sentences were increased for:
  - possessing a weapon (9.4%);
  - a leadership or supervisory role in the offense (11.5%).
- Sentences were decreased for:
  - minor or minimal participation in the offense (7.0%);
  - meeting the safety valve criteria in the sentencing guidelines (38.0%).
- The top five districts for oxycodone trafficking offenders were:
  - ♦ Eastern District of Pennsylvania (23):
  - ♦ Southern District of New York (21);
  - District of North Dakota (19);
  - Eastern District of Kentucky (17);
  - Northern District of Ohio (13).

# **Punishment**


- The average sentence for oxycodone trafficking offenders was 39 months.
- 86.1% were sentenced to prison.
- Oxycodone trafficking does not carry a mandatory minimum penalty.



# Sentences Relative to the Guideline Range


- Of the 59.9% of oxycodone trafficking offenders sentenced under the Guidelines Manual:
  - ♦ 42.4% were sentenced within the guideline range.
  - 50.0% received a substantial assistance departure.
    - ♦ Their average sentence reduction was 68.6%.
  - 7.0% received some other downward departure.
    - ♦ Their average sentence reduction was 60.6%.
- 40.1% received a variance; of those offenders:
  - 100.0% received a downward variance.
    - ♦ Their average sentence reduction was 49.5%.
- The average guideline minimum and the average sentence imposed fluctuated over the past five years.
  - The average guideline minimum was 69 months in fiscal year 2016 and fiscal year 2020.
  - The average sentence imposed increased and decreased throughout the fiscal years. The average sentence was 44 months in fiscal year 2016 and 39 months in fiscal year 2020.

# Sentence Relative to the Guideline Range (%)




# Average Guideline Minimum and Average Sentence

- 1 Drug offenses include cases where offenders were sentenced under USSG Chapter Two, Part D (Drugs). There were 317 oxycodone offenders sentenced under USSG Chapter Two, Part D (Drugs) in FY 2020.
- 2 Drug Trafficking offenders were sentenced under USSG §§2D1.1 (Drug Trafficking), 2D1.2 (Protected Locations), 2D1.5 (Continuing Criminal Enterprise), 2D1.6 (Use of a Communication Facility), 2D1.8 (Rent/Manage Drug Establishment), 2D1.10 (Endangering Human Life), or 2D1.14 (Narco-Terrorism).
- 3 Cases with incomplete sentencing information were excluded from analysis.
