

#### **Current Illegal Reentry Guideline- §2L1.2**

Base Offense Level

 If the defendant was deported, or unlawfully remained in the U.S. after –

 Felony drug trafficking offense with sentence imposed greater than 13 months, crimes of violence, a firearms offense, child pornography offense, a national security or terrorism offense, a human trafficking offense or an alien smuggling offense

#### **Current Illegal Reentry Guideline - §2L1.2**


- If the defendant was deported, or unlawfully remained in the U.S. after –
  - Felony drug trafficking offense with sentence of 13 mos. or less imposed or a +16 offense that did not receive criminal history points

- Aggravated felony conviction or a +12 offense that did not receive criminal history points
- Any other felony conviction or 3+ misdemeanors that are crimes of violence or drug trafficking crimes


# Distribution of Illegal Reentry Defendants by Current §2L1.2 (b)(1) Level







#### Average Guideline Minimum and Average Sentence Illegal Reentry Defendants Fiscal Years 2011 - 2015





#### Commission Research Project Fiscal Year 2013 Data

- 10% Sample of cases with all documentation from Fiscal Year 2013;
- 1,897 Cases coded:
  - All offenses that received criminal history points;
  - Date of first and last deportation; and
  - Number of deportations.



#### Commission Research Project Fiscal Year 2013 Data

- 69.7% had a prior conviction before their first deportation;
- 61.9% had a prior conviction *after* their first deportation;
- 27.2% of defendants had a prior illegal reentry conviction; and
- The average number of deportations was 3.2 per defendant.

## **Amendment for §2L1.2 – ILLEGAL REENTRY**



#### How the Amendment Responds to Concerns

- Simplifies guideline calculation by eliminating the "categorical approach" and basing enhancements for prior criminal convictions on the length of sentence imposed;
- Accounts for prior criminal conduct committed by the defendant in a broader and more proportionate manner:
  - Reduces the level of the most severe enhancements in the current guideline
  - Includes a new enhancement for prior illegal reentry convictions
  - Has separate enhancements for prior felony convictions occurring before and after a defendant's first order of deportation

#### **Promulgated Illegal Reentry Amendment - §2L1.2**

Base Offense Level

8

- Specific Offense Characteristics
  - (b) (1) Considers the number of illegal reentries

[+4] or [+2]

- (b)(2) Considers the convictions before the defendant's first order of deportation [+10], [+8], [+6], [+4], or [+2]
- (b)(3) Considers the convictions occurring after the defendant's first order of deportation [+10], [+8], [+6], [+4], or [+2]



#### First Factor: Number of Prior Illegal Reentry Convictions

## New (b)(1):

- (b)(1)(A) One or more felony illegal reentry convictions [+4]
- (b)(1)(B) Two or more misdemeanor illegal entry convictions [+2]
- For the enhancement to apply, the conviction must receive criminal history points



# Second Factor: Length of Prior Sentence Before First Order of Deportation

• (b)(2) – If before the first order of deportation, the defendant sustained:

<ul> <li>Felony conviction with sentence of ≥ 5 years imposed</li> </ul>	[+10]
<ul> <li>Felony conviction with sentence of ≥ 2 years imposed</li> </ul>	[+8]
<ul> <li>Felony conviction with sentence of &gt; 13 months imposed</li> </ul>	[+6]
Any other felony conviction	[+4]
• 3+ misdemeanor convictions for drug trafficking or crimes	[+2]
of violence, or both	

- For the enhancement to apply, the conviction must receive criminal history points
- Do not count illegal reentry convictions for this enhancement

# Third Factor: Length of Prior Sentence After First Order of Deportation

• (b)(3)– If after the first order of deportation, the defendant sustained:

<ul> <li>Felony conviction with sentence of ≥ 5 years imposed</li> </ul>	[+10]
<ul> <li>Felony conviction with sentence of ≥ 2 years imposed</li> </ul>	[+8]
<ul> <li>Felony conviction with sentence of &gt; 13 months imposed</li> </ul>	[+6]
Any other felony conviction	[+4]
• 3+ misdemeanor convictions for drug trafficking or	[+2]
crimes of violence, or both	

- For the enhancement to apply, the conviction must receive criminal history points
- Illegal reentry convictions do not count for this SOC



## **Average Number of Deportations** by Number of Illegal Reentry Convictions Average Number of Deportations




#### New (b)(1) Based on Prior Illegal Reentry Convictions




#### Average Sentence Length for Prior Felony Convictions: Offenses Receiving Criminal History Points by Major Offense Types




