Dear Judge Saris:

I have the letter from James E. Felman, Esquire and Stephen A. Saltzberg, Esquire dated December 5, 2014 and the attached report. I, for one, do not believe that the Guidelines respecting economic crimes produce overly harsh sentences in most cases. Indeed, I can recall no case in which the sentence was overly harsh considering the ruinous results that such conduct produced in the lives of victims of the crimes involved. Moreover, I believe that, by providing stiff sentences for those who commit crimes of this sort, the Guidelines serve all of the purposes of 18 U.S.C. § 3553(a). In any event, district judges have considerable discretion to depart or vary from the Guidelines, and that discretion can provide relief in cases in which the Guidelines' result would be greater than necessary to achieve those objectives.
