CHAIR REEVES: State sentencing commission Carlton W. Reeves and I welcome you all to this public meeting. Due to the ongoing cleanup from the snow and -- that blanketed the DC area and many parts of the country, this meeting will be conducted remotely. I thank each of you for joining us via live stream. In the event that we lose the live stream connection or encounter any technological issues, the meeting will be recorded and made available on our website, WWW.USSC.gov.

I have the honor of opening this meeting with my fellow commissioners. Joining us via live stream, we have Vice Chair Luis Felipe Restrepo, Vice Chair Laura Mate, and Vice Chair Claire Murray, as well as Commissioner Candice Wong, and our ex officio commissioner Scott Meisler. We are also joined by the commission employees, again via live stream.

They have done the research, they have assisted us in doing the work, they have drafted these policies, and this week they have worked to ensure

1 that the technology allows us to continue the  
2 important work of the commission uninterrupted.  
3 And I thank the staff immensely for going above and  
4 beyond the call of duty. They've done all of this  
5 to make this meeting possible. So, on behalf of  
6 the commissioners and the public, staff, I thank  
7 all of you for everything that you've done, all the  
8 amazing work that you do every single day.

9 The first order of business is a vote to adopt  
10 the December 12th, 2025 public meeting minutes.

11 Is there a motion to do so?

12 COMMISSIONER MEISLER: So moved.

13 CHAIR REEVES: Is there a second?

14 VICE CHAIR MATE: Second.

15 VICE CHAIR MURRAY: Second.

16 CHAIR REEVES: Is there any discussion on  
17 the motion?

18 Having no discussion, vote on the motion by  
19 saying 'Aye'.

20 (Chorus of aye.)

21 CHAIR REEVES: Any nays? No nays. The  
22 motion is adopted by voice vote.

1           The next item of business is a possible vote  
2 to publish in the federal register proposed  
3 guideline amendments and issues for public comment.

4       The Deputy Attorney -- excuse me, the Deputy  
5 General Counsel Matt Iaconetti will advise a  
6 commission on the first possible vote concerning  
7 a proposed sentencing options amendment.

8           MR. IACONETTI: Thank you Judge Reeves.

9       The first amendment before you labeled 'sentencing  
10 options' is a two part amendment. The commission  
11 is considering whether to promulgate any or all  
12 parts of the amendment, as they are not mutually  
13 exclusive.

14       Part A of the proposed amendment would amend  
15 Part A of Chapter Five to make two changes. First,  
16 it would add new introductory commentary to Part  
17 A of Chapter Five. Second, it would add a new  
18 guideline, Section 5A 1.1, and as a result  
19 redesignate the sentencing table as Section 5A 1.2,  
20 and make technical changes to the existing  
21 commentary in the introduction.

22       Part B of the proposed amendment expands Zone

1 B and Zone C of the sentencing table and makes  
2 conforming changes to Section 5B 1.1 and Section  
3 5C 1.1 regarding the imposition of a term of  
4 probation or imprisonment.

5 Issues for comment are also provided for each  
6 part. The motion to publish the amendment with the  
7 public comment period closing on March 18th, 2026  
8 and technical and conforming amendment authority  
9 to staff is appropriate at this time.

10 CHAIR REEVES: Thank you. Is there a  
11 motion to publish the proposed amendment as  
12 suggested by our Deputy General Counsel.

13 VICE CHAIR MURRAY: So moved.

14 CHAIR REEVES: Is there a second?

15 COMMISSIONER MEISLER: Second.

16 CHAIR REEVES: Is there any discussion on  
17 the motion?

18 Now, let's vote on the motion by saying 'Aye'.

19 (Chorus of aye.)

20 CHAIR REEVES: Any nays?

21 The motion is adopted and let the record reflect  
22 that at least three commissioners voted in favor

1 of the motion to publish. The Deputy General  
2 Counsel will now advise the commission on a possible  
3 vote concerning a proposed career offender  
4 amendment.

5 MR. IACONETTI: Thank you Judge. The  
6 proposed career offender amendment has multiple  
7 parts. It addresses the crime of violence  
8 definition in the guideline, the controlled  
9 substance definition in the guideline, as well as  
10 both definitions in Section 2K 2.1. Each part of  
11 the amendment has two parts. The commission is  
12 considering whether to promulgate any or all parts  
13 of this amendment, as they are not mutually  
14 exclusive.

15 The proposed amendment would revise the  
16 approach to determining whether an offense  
17 qualifies as a crime of violence by numerating  
18 federal statute and analogous state crimes that  
19 qualify or defining certain crimes based on their  
20 designation or label as designated in the States.

21 The proposed amendment would amend the term  
22 'controlled substance offense' in section 4B 1.2,

1 by listing federal drug trafficking statutes to  
2 define a controlled substance, or by maintaining  
3 the current definition but setting a minimum  
4 sentence length requirement for prior conviction  
5 to qualify. And the proposed amendment would also  
6 amend Section 2K 2.1 to incorporate the current  
7 relevant parts of Section 4B 1.2 to define the terms  
8 'crime of violence' and 'controlled substance  
9 offense' or alternatively by amending the  
10 definitions based on the terms 'serious drug  
11 offense', 'violent felony', and Section 924E of  
12 Title 18 of the United States Code.

13 Issues for comment are also provided for each  
14 part. A motion to publish the amendment with the  
15 public comment period closing on March 18th, 2026  
16 and technical and conforming amendment authority  
17 to staff is appropriate at this time.

18 CHAIR REEVES: Is there a motion to  
19 publish the proposed amendment as suggested by the  
20 Deputy General Counsel.

21 VICE CHAIR MURRAY: So moved.

22 CHAIR REEVES: Is there a second?

1 COMMISSIONER WONG: Second.

2 CHAIR REEVES: Is there any discussion on  
3 the motion?

4 Let's vote on the motion then by saying 'Aye'.

5 (Chorus of aye.)

6 CHAIR REEVES: Any nays?

7 The motion is adopted and let the record reflect  
8 that at least three commissioners voted in favor  
9 of the motion to publish. The Deputy General  
10 Counsel will now advise the commission on a possible  
11 vote on a proposed amendment on circuit conflicts  
12 concerning Section 4B 1.2.

13 MR. IACONETTI: Before you, you have an  
14 amendment that addresses two circuit conflicts that  
15 contain multiple parts. As before, the commission  
16 is considering whether to promulgate any or all  
17 parts of this amendment, as they are not mutually  
18 exclusive.

19 The proposed amendment will provide a  
20 definition for the term 'controlled substance' to  
21 address the circuit conflict concerning whether the  
22 term 'controlled substance' only covers those



1 offenses controlled by federal law or also controls  
2 -- is also defined based on those defenses  
3 controlled by state law.

4 The proposed amendment also addresses circuit  
5 conflict regarding the temporal version of the drug  
6 schedule used to define controlled substance  
7 events. Either that at the place of the time of  
8 the defendants prior conviction or at the time of  
9 the incident offense for sentencing. The proposed  
10 amendment would also amend the commentary in Section  
11 201.2 which uses the term 'drug trafficking offense'  
12 which closely tracks the definition of 'controlled  
13 substance offense', Section 4B 1.2. It sets for the  
14 same options.

15 Issues for comment are also provided for each.

16 A motion to publish the amendment with the public  
17 comment period closing on March 18th, 2026 with  
18 technical and conforming amendment authority to  
19 staff is appropriate at this time.

20 CHAIR REEVES: Is there a motion to  
21 publish the proposed amendment as suggested by the  
22 Deputy General Counsel.

1 VICE CHAIR MURRAY: So moved.

2 COMMISSIONER MEISLER: So moved.

3 CHAIR REEVES: Is there a second?

4 VICE CHAIR MURRAY: Second.

5 COMMISSIONER MEISLER: Second.

6 CHAIR REEVES: Is there any discussion on  
7 the motion?

8 Hearing no discussion, let's vote on the motion  
9 by saying 'Aye'.

10 (Chorus of aye.)

11 CHAIR REEVES: Are there any nays?

12 The motion is adopted and let the record reflect  
13 that at least three commissioners voted in favor  
14 of the motion to publish. Our Deputy General  
15 Counsel will now advice the commission on a possible  
16 vote concerning a proposed human smuggling  
17 amendment.

18 MR. IACONETTI: The proposed human  
19 smuggling amendment amends Section 201.2 to address  
20 the risk and harm in those offenses. It also  
21 provides a cross reference, instructing courts to  
22 apply the guideline from Chapter 2 Part A subpart

1 3 in appropriate cases to address the risk and harm  
2 to those offenses as well.

3 Issues for comment are also provided. A motion  
4 to publish the amendment with public comment period  
5 closing on March 18th, 2026 with technical and  
6 conforming amendment authority to staff is  
7 appropriate at this time.

8 CHAIR REEVES: Is there a motion to  
9 publish the proposed amendment as suggested by the  
10 Deputy General Counsel.

11 VICE CHAIR MURRAY: So moved.

12 CHAIR REEVES: Is there a second?

13 COMMISSIONER WONG: Second.

14 CHAIR REEVES: Is there any discussion on  
15 the motion?

16 Hearing no discussion, let's vote on the motion  
17 by saying 'Aye'.

18 (Chorus of aye.)

19 CHAIR REEVES: Are there any nays?

20 The motion is adopted and let the record reflect  
21 that at least three commissioners voted in favor  
22 of the motion to publish. Now, is there any further

1 business before the commission?

2 The only thing I would like to do is invite  
3 the public to attend our public hearing that will  
4 occur February the 17th, 2026. We hope to begin  
5 it at 9 a.m. and we hope that we all are together  
6 in person and that we'll, of course, we'll be  
7 broadcasted by live stream. Is there anything  
8 further?

9 Hearing nothing, is there a motion to adjourn?

10 VICE CHAIR MURRAY: So moved.

11 CHAIR REEVES: Is there a second?

12 VICE CHAIR MATE: Second.

13 COMMISSIONER MEISLER: Second.

14 CHAIR REEVES: Let's follow on motion by  
15 saying 'Aye'. All in favor?

16 (Chorus of aye.)

17 CHAIR REEVES: Any opposed? All right,  
18 thank you so much. The motion is adopted by voice  
19 vote and the meeting now adjourned.
