Methodology

Study Group Criteria (23,381 Individuals)

- Released from incarceration or commenced a term of probation in 2015
- United States citizens
- Received at least one criminal history point at sentencing

Data Sources

- Commission data on age and criminal history
- FBI (RAP sheet) data on arrests from all state and federal agencies

Measuring Rearrest


- Three-year follow-up period
- Includes arrests for violations of supervised release, probation, or parole
- Excludes minor traffic offenses

Overall Study Group Three-Year Rearrest Rates



Overall Study Group Most Serious Rearrest Offense








Option 2: Juvenile Adjudications Do Not Receive CH Points Most Serious Rearrest Offense



Option 2: Juvenile Adjudications Do Not Receive CH Points Three-Year Rearrest Rates – <u>Similar Age Group Comparison</u>

	At Least 1 CH Point for a Juvenile Adjudication (N=980)	At Least 1 CH Point, but None for a Juvenile Adjudication & <u>Age 25 and Under</u> <u>at Sentencing</u> (N=3,122)
Percent Rearrested	66.9%	60.0%
Median Months to Arrest	10	10



Option 3: Offenses Committed Prior to Age 18 Do Not Receive CH Points Three-Year Rearrest Rates

	At Least 1 CH Point for an Offense Prior to Age 18 (N=2,446)	At Least 1 CH Point, but None for an Offense Prior to Age 18 (N=20,935)
Percent Rearrested	62.7%	42.3%
Median Months to Arrest	10	12
