
## Methamphetamine

- Sets forth **two** options for amending §2D1.1 to address the purity distinction between methamphetamine in “actual” form and methamphetamine as part of a mixture.
- Both options would also amend §2D1.1 to delete all references to “Ice” and add a new specific offense characteristic at §2D1.1(b)(19) that provides a [2]-level reduction if the offense involved only methamphetamine in a non-smokable, non-crystalline form.



## Average Sentence (in months)






- Sets the same quantity thresholds for all methamphetamine offenses.

## Methamphetamine

### Option 2 – Use Different Entries for Methamphetamine with Reducing and Heightening Factors

- Sets the baseline quantity thresholds at a level between the current base offense level quantity thresholds for mixture and actual.
- Brackets setting the baseline quantity thresholds at the same level as cocaine base.
- The base offense level may be either reduced to the current base offense levels for mixture or heightened to the current base offense levels for actual, when [1][2][3] or more certain factors apply.





# B

## Fentanyl-Related Substances

- Responds to the enactment of the Halt All Lethal Trafficking of Fentanyl Act (HALT Fentanyl Act), which permanently scheduled “fentanyl-related substances.”
- Amends the Drug Quantity Table at subsection (c) §2D1.1 to add “fentanyl-related substances.”
- Sets the quantity thresholds and base offense levels at the same level as fentanyl analogues.
- Amends the enhancement at §2D1.1(b)(13) to add “fentanyl-related substance.”

## Fentanyl and Fentanyl Analogue Enhancements

Adds four new specific offense characteristics in cases involving fentanyl and fentanyl analogues:

1. Distribution to an individual less than [18][21] years of age or use of an individual less than [18][21] years of age.
  - Bracketed alternatives addressing difference in age between the defendant and the individual less than [18][21] years of age.
  - Defendant-based alternative brackets a *mens rea* requirement of knowledge relating to the age of the individual and to the substance involved in the offense.
2. Use of the dark web to facilitate the commission or concealment of the offense.
3. Distribution of a mixture or substance containing xylazine.
4. Use or possession of a pill press.

## Fentanyl and Fentanyl Analogue Enhancements

### **Distribution to an individual less than [18][21] years of age or use of an individual less than [18][21] years of age**

- In Fiscal Year 2023, 37 cases involved distribution of fentanyl or a fentanyl analogue to a person under 21 years old.
- The age of the person receiving the drug in these cases ranged from 14 to 21 years old.
- Of these cases:
  - The base offense level was determined by the Drug Quantity Table in 17 cases.
  - The base offense level was determined by §2D1.1(a)(1)-(4) for death and bodily injury in 14 cases.
- The most often applied enhancements in these cases were:
  - Weapon enhancement at §2D1.1(b)(1), 9 cases
  - Premises enhancement at §2D1.1(b)(12), 5 cases
  - Violence enhancement at §2D1.1(b)(2), 3 cases
  - Mass-marketing enhancement at §2D1.1(b)(7), 3 cases

## Fentanyl and Fentanyl Analogue Enhancements

### **Use of the dark web to facilitate the commission or concealment of the offense**

- In Fiscal Year 2023, **60 cases** involved the use of the dark web or cryptocurrency during a fentanyl or fentanyl analogue trafficking offense.
- Of these cases:
  - 39 cases involved both the use of the dark web and cryptocurrency.
  - 17 cases involved only the use of the dark web.
  - 4 cases involved only the use of cryptocurrency.
- The most often applied enhancements in these cases were:
  - Mass-marketing enhancement at §2D1.1(b)(7), 27 cases
  - Misrepresentation of fentanyl enhancement at §2D1.1(b)(13), 17 cases
  - Weapon enhancement at §2D1.1(b)(1), 12 cases
  - Premises enhancement at §2D1.1(b)(12), 11 cases

## Fentanyl and Fentanyl Analogue Enhancements

### **Distribution of a mixture or substance containing xylazine**

- In Fiscal Year 2023, **94 cases** involved mixing fentanyl or a fentanyl analogue with xylazine or medetomidine.
- Of these cases:
  - 90 cases used xylazine as the mixing agent.
  - 4 cases used medetomidine as the mixing agent.
- The most often applied enhancements in these cases were:
  - Weapon enhancement at §2D1.1(b)(1), 37 cases
  - Premises enhancement at §2D1.1(b)(12), 22 cases
  - All other enhancements were applied in 2 or fewer cases.

- In Fiscal Year 2023, **84 cases** involved the use of a pill press to press fentanyl or a fentanyl analogue.
- Of these cases:
  - 72 cases used a pill press with fentanyl.
  - 12 cases used a pill press with a fentanyl analogue.
- The most often applied enhancements in these cases were:
  - Weapon enhancement at §2D1.1(b)(1), 37 cases
  - Premises enhancement at §2D1.1(b)(12), 26 cases
  - Misrepresentation of fentanyl enhancement at §2D1.1(b)(13), 15 cases
  - Mass marketing enhancement at §2D1.1(b)(7), 11 cases
