Of the 66,873 cases received by the Commission, 141 were excluded as the defendant was only convicted of 18 U.S.C. § 1028A and another 290 were excluded as the defendant was only convicted of 18 U.S.C. § 924(c). By statute, the punishment for these crimes must be served consecutively to any other punishment, therefore, in these cases the conviction for this crime did not affect the offender for the underlying offense. Of the remaining 66,442 cases, 61,917 contained complete guideline information (92.6 percent of all cases). An additional 10 cases had missing information on the guideline that controlled the offender.
