


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Counterfeit Offenses

## Fiscal Year 2018

- IN FY 2018, 69,425 CASES WERE REPORTED TO THE U.S. SENTENCING COMMISSION.
  - ▶ 228 OF THESE INVOLVED COUNTERFEITING BEARER OBLIGATIONS OF THE UNITED STATES.<sup>1,2</sup>
    - ► COUNTERFEIT OFFENSES HAVE DECREASED BY 53.1% SINCE FY 2014.

#### Offender and Offense Characteristics

- 75.3% of counterfeit offenders were men.
- 44.3% were White, 35.8% were Black, 15.9% were Hispanic, and 4.0% were Other races.
- Their average age was 34 years.
- 94.7% were United States citizens.
- 28.2% had little or no prior criminal history (Criminal History Category I); 18.1% were CHC VI.
- The median loss for these offenses was \$3,755.
  - ♦ 80.0% involved loss amounts of \$15,000 or less.<sup>3</sup>
  - ♦ 1.9% involved loss amounts greater than \$150,000.
- Sentences were increased for:
  - manufacturing or producing counterfeit obligations or possessing counterfeiting paper, altered currency paper, or a counterfeit deterrent (54.6%);
  - possessing a firearm or other dangerous weapon in connection with the offense (2.6%);
  - committing any part of the offense outside the United States (3.1%);
  - leadership or supervisory role in the offense (3.1%); and
  - obstructing or impeding the administration of justice (2.2%).
- Sentences were decreased for:
  - minor or minimal participation in the offense (2.2%).
- The top six districts for counterfeit offenders were:
  - ♦ District of South Carolina (17);
  - ♦ Southern District of Florida (13);
  - ♦ Central District of California (11);
  - ♦ Northern District of Illinois (8);
  - ♦ Middle District of Pennsylvania (7);
  - Eastern District of Washington (7).

# **Punishment**


- The average sentence for counterfeit offenders was 15 months.
- 79.7% of counterfeit offenders were sentenced to prison.
- 2.2% were convicted of an offense carrying a mandatory minimum penalty; none were relieved of the penalty.



# Sentences Relative to the Guideline Range

- Of the 70.5% of counterfeit offenders sentenced under the Guidelines Manual:
  - ♦ 84.4% were sentenced within the guideline range.
  - 13.1% received a substantial assistance departure.
    - ♦ Their average sentence reduction was 48.0%.
  - 2.5% received some other downward departure.
    - ♦ Their average sentence reduction was 41.8%.
- 29.5% received a variance: of those offenders:
  - 98.5% received a downward variance.
    - ♦ Their average sentence reduction was 52.5%.
  - ♦ 1.5% received an upward variance.
- The average guideline minimum and average sentence imposed has remained relatively steady over the past five years.
  - The average guideline minimum increased from 17 months in fiscal year 2014 to 18 months in fiscal year 2018.
  - The average sentence imposed decreased from 16 months in fiscal year 2014 to 15 months in fiscal year 2018.

# Sentence Imposed Relative to the Guideline Range FY 2018




