- ► THERE WERE 71,003 CASES REPORTED TO THE UNITED STATES SENTENCING COMMISSION IN FISCAL YEAR 2015.
- ► OF THESE CASES, 19,792 INVOLVED DRUG TRAFFICKING.¹
- ▶ 4.2% OF DRUG TRAFFICKING OFFENSES INVOLVED OXYCODONE.

Quick Facts

Oxycodone Trafficking Offenses

In fiscal year 2015, there were 827 oxycodone trafficking offenders, who accounted for 4.2% of all offenders sentenced under the drug trafficking guidelines. The number of oxycodone offenders has increased by 6.6% since fiscal year 2011.


Offender and Offense Characteristics

- In fiscal year 2015, approximately three-quarters of oxycodone trafficking offenders were male (73.8%).
- Over half of oxycodone trafficking offenders were White (56.1%) followed by Black (31.5%), Hispanic (8.4%), and Other Races (4.1%).
- The average age of these offenders at sentencing was 38 years.
- Nearly all oxycodone trafficking offenders were United States citizens (97.6%).
- Just under half (49.2%) of oxycodone trafficking offenders had little or no prior criminal history (i.e., assigned to Criminal History Category I) while 5.9% were Career Offenders (§4B1.1).
- The median base offense level in these cases was 26. This corresponds to a quantity of drugs between 1,990 and 3,483 30-milligram instant release pills.
- Oxycodone trafficking sentences were increased for:
 - 9.2% of offenders because the offense involved the possession of a weapon;
 - 11.7% of offenders for having a leadership or supervisory role in the offense.
- Oxycodone trafficking sentences were decreased for:
 - 7.9% of offenders because they were a minor or minimal participant in the offense;
 - ♦ 30.5% of offenders because they met the safety valve criteria in the sentencing guidelines.

Punishment

- Most oxycodone trafficking offenders were sentenced to imprisonment (88.0%).
- The average sentence for oxycodone trafficking offenders was 46 months.
- There is no mandatory minimum penalty for oxycodone drug trafficking offenses.






Sentences Relative to the Guideline Range


- The rate of within range sentences for oxycodone trafficking in fiscal year 2015 was 23.8%.
- The rate of government sponsored below range sentences for oxycodone trafficking offenders generally increased in recent years, before decreasing to 46.9% in fiscal year 2015.
 - Substantial assistance departures were granted for approximately one-third of offenders in each of the past five years.
 - ♦ In fiscal year 2015, these offenders received an average reduction in their sentence of 58.2%.
 - In each of the last five years, Early Disposition Program (EDP) departures² were rarely granted for oxycodone trafficking offenders.
 - ♦ The rate of oxycodone trafficking offenders receiving a below range sentence sponsored by the government for reasons other than substantial assistance or participation in an Early Disposition Program generally increased in recent years before decreasing to 12.3% in fiscal year 2015.
 - ♦ In fiscal year 2015, these offenders received an average reduction in their sentence of 52.8%.
- The rate of non-government sponsored below range sentences for oxycodone traffickers has remained relatively stable over the past five years, ranging from a high of 31.1% in fiscal year 2012 to a low of 28.5% in fiscal year 2015.
 - ♦ In fiscal year 2015, these offenders received an average reduction in their sentence of 45.1%.
- The average guideline minimum for oxycodone trafficking has fluctuated over the past five years while average sentences have generally decreased.
 - ◆ The average guideline minimum decreased from 80 months in fiscal year 2014 to 75 months in fiscal year 2015;
 - ♦ The average sentence imposed decreased from 57 months in fiscal year 2012 to 46 months in fiscal year 2015.

Oxycodone Trafficking Offenses






Government Sponsored Below Range Sentences FY 2015
