
Oxycodone Trafficking Offenses

#### Fiscal Year 2022

- IN FY 2022, 64.142 CASES WERE REPORTED TO THE U.S. SENTENCING COMMISSION.
  - 20.037 CASES INVOLVED DRUGS.<sup>1</sup>
    - ► 19,851 INVOLVED DRUG TRAFFICKING.<sup>2</sup>
      - ▶ 1.4% OF DRUG TRAFFICKING CASES INVOLVED OXYCODONE.
        - OXYCODONE TRAFFICKING OFFENSES HAVE DECREASED BY 33.3% SINCE FY 2018.

## Offender and Offense Characteristics

- 70.4% of oxycodone trafficking offenders were men.
- 40.7% were Black, 32.2% were White, 12.8% were Hispanic, and 14.3% were Other races.
- Their average age was 41 years.
- 97.4% were United States citizens.
- 62.4% had little or no prior criminal history (Criminal History Category I); 1.5% were career offenders (§4B1.1).
- The median base offense level in these cases was 26, corresponding to between 1,990 and 3,483 30-milligram instant release pills of oxycodone.
- Sentences were increased for:
  - possessing a weapon (12.8%);
  - a leadership or supervisory role in the offense (15.7%).
- Sentences were decreased for:
  - minor or minimal participation in the offense (10.2%);
  - meeting the safety valve criteria in the sentencing guidelines (40.1%).
- The top districts for oxycodone trafficking offenders were:
  - District of North Dakota (45);
  - ♦ Eastern District of Pennsylvania (20);
  - ♦ Middle District of Alabama (18);
  - Northern District of Ohio (17);
  - ♦ Southern District of New York (16).

#### **Punishment**

- The average sentence for oxycodone trafficking offenders was 40 months.
- 79.6% were sentenced to prison.
- Oxycodone trafficking does not carry a mandatory minimum penalty.



# Sentences Relative to the Guideline Range

- Of the 56.9% of oxycodone trafficking offenders sentenced under the Guidelines Manual:
  - ♦ 26.3% were sentenced within the guideline range.
  - 67.9% received a substantial assistance departure.

     Their average sentence reduction was 76.6%.
  - 4.5% received some other downward departure.
    - ♦ Their average sentence reduction was 62.4%.
- 43.1% received a variance; of those offenders:
  - 98.3% received a downward variance.
    - Their average sentence reduction was 59.1%.
  - ♦ 1.7% received an upward variance.
- The average guideline minimum increased and average sentence imposed decreased over the past five years.
  - ♦ The average guideline minimum increased from 76 months in fiscal year 2018 to 77 months in fiscal year 2022.
  - ♦ The average sentence imposed decreased from 50 months in fiscal year 2018 to 40 months in fiscal year 2022.


### Sentence Imposed Relative to the Guideline Range FY 2022

Variances




# Average Guideline Minimum and Average Sentence

- 1 Drug offenses include cases where offenders were sentenced under USSG Chapter Two, Part D (Drugs). There were 301 oxycodone offenders sentenced under USSG Chapter Two, Part D (Drugs) in FY 2022.
- 2 Drug Trafficking offenders were sentenced under USSG §§2D1.1 (Drug Trafficking), 2D1.2 (Protected Locations), 2D1.5 (Continuing Criminal Enterprise), 2D1.6 (Use of a Communication Facility), 2D1.8 (Rent/Manage Drug Establishment), 2D1.10 (Endangering Human Life), or 2D1.14 (Narco-Terrorism).
- 3 Cases with incomplete sentencing information were excluded from the analysis.
- 4 "Early Disposition Program (or EDP) departures" are departures where the government sought a sentence below the guideline range because the defendant participated in the government's Early Disposition Program, through which cases are resolved in an expedited manner. See USSG §5K3.1.
