Four purpose of the VAG are to:

(1) assist the Commission in carrying out its statutory responsibilities under 28 U.S.C. § 994(o);

(2) provide to the Commission its views on the Commission's activities and work, including proposed priorities and amendments, as they relate to victims of crime;

(3) disseminate information regarding sentencing issues to organizations represented on the VAG and to other victims of crime and victims advocacy groups, as appropriate; and

(4) perform any other functions related to victims of crime as the Commission requests.

- What roles and responsibilities do probation officers have regarding victims? ("victims" includes a victim's representatives)
- Are the procedures of interactions between probation officers and victims consistent across Districts?

VICTIMS INTERACTIONS WITH PROBATION

- Pre-sentencing Process
 - Factors in the PSR (Guidelines and Departures)
 - Victim Impact Statement
 - Written
 - Oral
 - Restitution
- Supervision Process
 - Restitution
 - Provisions related to no contact

VICTIMS INTERACTIONS WITH PROBATION QUESTIONS

- From the perspective of the probation agents, is working with victims
 - Easy or Difficult?
 - What could make the process of interacting with victims better?

SENTENCING COMMISSION VICTIM VIDEO

- New resource for probation officers to assist victims in the presentence process
- Key issue to be beneficial, victims will need to know that:
 - video is available
 - Where to find the video

SENTENCING COMMISSION VICTIM VIDEO – BENEFIT TO PROBATION

- Help to provide resources to victim
- Help probation agent regarding:
 - Factors in the PSR (Guidelines and Departures)
 - Victim Impact Statement
 - Written
 - Oral
 - Restitution

SENTENCING COMMISSION VICTIM VIDEO – BENEFIT TO VICTIMS

- Better understand process
- Better understand roles and responsibility
- Better convey to probation officers and court the impact of the crime and their views related to sentencing and restitution

TAKE HOME POINTS

- Sentencing Commission video is a resource that you should be provided to victims
- If you do not provide video information to victims, it is unlikely that victims will stumble upon it
- Video is a means of helping provide justice to victims by giving victims information to assist themselves

CONCLUSION

 - Probation officers in interacting with victims and regarding their other pre-sentencing obligations.
