Multiple Counts Rationale

• Determine a single offense level

- Prevent "double-counting"
- Provide incremental punishment
- Limit prosecutorial impact

Process of "Grouping"

The determination as to whether multiple counts of conviction are to be treated as a single composite harm or as separate harms as defined by the guidelines' "grouping rules"

"Grouping Rules"

§3D1.2

(a) Same Victim, Same Act

(b) Same Victim, Two or More Acts

(c) Conduct Treated by Characteristic

(d) Based on an Aggregate

Steps in Multiple Counts

1. Grouping

- Group under "Rule (d)"
- Group under "Rules (a), (b), or (c)"

2. Incremental Increases

- Assignment of units
- Additional offense levels

Step 1: Grouping "Rule (d)"

If counts use the same Chapter Two guideline and

If that guideline is <u>included</u> at §3D1.2(d):

Apply the guidelines as in single count application

Offenses Included at §3D1.2(d):

Offenses covered by the following guidelines are to be grouped under this subsection:

Examples of Chapter Two Guidelines in the Included List at §3D1.2(d)

NOTE: This is the Same List for which "Expanded Relevant Conduct" at §1B1.3(a)(2) Applies

- Drug trafficking
- Fraud, theft, & embezzlement
- Firearms
- Alien smuggling
- Trafficking/possession of child pornography

- Money laundering
- Tax violations
- Counterfeiting
- Bribery
- Other similar offenses

One application with the offense level for the group based on the aggregate and the conduct "taken as a whole"

Pointers Regarding "Grouping Rule (d)"

- Guideline application for counts grouped under "Rule (d)" involves
 - The adding ("aggregation") of the numerical quantities
 - Application for the conduct "taken as a whole"
 - See Chapter Three, Part D, Introductory Commentary; §3D1.3, App. Note 3

Single Guideline Application for Counts Grouping under "Rule (d)"

- Base Offense Level
- Specific Offense Characteristics
- Cross References

Chapter Three

- Victim
- Role
- Obstruction
- Multiple Counts
- Acceptance

Example of Rule (d) - Smuggling Aliens

- Defendant is convicted of three counts of smuggling aliens, each on a specific date; violation of 8 USC § 1324(a); applicable guideline §2L1.1
- Each count involves Defendant smuggling five aliens
- Defendant possessed a firearm during one trip
- Because the applicable guideline for the three counts is in the included list at §3D1.2(d), the counts will group under Rule (d)

Example of Rule (d) - Smuggling Aliens (cont.)

• Because the relevant conduct of three counts includes the smuggling of 15 aliens, that is the number that will be used in the application of the SOC at §2L1.1(b)(2)

• Because Defendant possessed a firearm during one of the offenses, the SOC at §2L1.1(b)(5) for possession of a firearm will apply

Pointers Regarding "Grouping Rule (d)"

• To group under "Rule (d)", the counts need only be in the "included" list at §3D1.2(d) and use the same Chapter Two guideline

- To group under "Rule (d)", the counts do not have to involve the same victim
 - See §3D1.2, Background

Counts Involving <u>Different</u> Chapter Two Guidelines on the "Included" List

§3D1.2(d), App. Note 6 & §3D1.3(b), App. Note 3

• <u>Different</u> guidelines <u>do not</u> group under "Rule (d)" merely by being

- on the "included" list

– on the same line on the "included" list

Counts Involving Chapter Two Guidelines on the "Excluded" List

§3D1.2(d)

• Counts excluded from grouping under "Rule (d)" are <u>not precluded</u> from grouping under "Rules (a), (b), or (c)" however

Application of Multiple Counts that <u>Do Not</u> Group under "Rule (d)"

Must determine whether counts group under "Rules (a), (b), or (c)" or whether they do not group and "units" must be assigned

Steps in Multiple Counts

- 1. Grouping
 - Group under "Rule (d)"
 - Group under "Rules (a), (b), or (c)"

- 2. Incremental Increases
 - Assignment of units
 - Additional offense levels

Step 1: Grouping "Rules (a), (b), or (c)"

If counts "group" under §3D1.2(a), (b), or (c):

Apply the guidelines separately to get an offense level for each count

Use the highest offense level

Impact of Counts Grouping under "Rules (a), (b), or (c)"

Count 1

Count 2

OL 23

Offense Level 23 for the group

(Analogous to counts running concurrently with each other)

"Rule (a)"

"When counts involve the *same victim* and the same act or transaction."

"Rule (b)"

"When counts involve the *same victim* and two or more acts or transactions connected by a common criminal objective or constituting part of a common scheme or plan."

"Rule (c)"

"When one of the counts embodies conduct that is treated as a specific offense characteristic in, or other adjustment to, the guideline applicable to another of the counts."

Grouping under "Rule (c)"

Robbery
(of bank)
OL 24
SOC addresses
injury to teller

Assault (of teller)
OL 17

Offense Level 24 for the group

Use of Multiple "Grouping Rules"

More than one "grouping rule" can be used to group various counts into a single count group

Steps in Multiple Counts

- 1. Grouping
 - Group under "Rule (d)"
 - Group under "Rules (a), (b), or (c)"
- 2. Incremental Increases
 - Assignment of units
 - Additional offense levels

Step 2: Incremental Increases


If more than one group:

• Compare the offense level of the highest group to the offense levels of the other groups, and assign "units"

• Increase the offense level of the highest group according to a guideline table corresponding to the number of "units"

Assign "Units" and Additional Levels

Simple Example:



Assignment of Units (§3D1.4)

Highest Offense Level (or Equal)	1
1-4 Levels Less Serious	1
5-8 Levels Less Serious	1/2
9 or More Levels Less Serious	0

Additional Offense Levels (§3D1.4)

Number of Units	Increase in Offense Level
1	None
1½	add 1 level
2	add 2 levels
2½ - 3	add 3 levels
3½ - 5	add 4 levels
more than 5	add 5 levels

Assignment of Units (§3D1.4)

Total Units 2

Additional Offense Levels (§3D1.4)

Total of 2 units = 2 additional offense levels

26 (higher group (Robbery 2))

+ 2 additional offense levels

28 combined offense level

Assign "Units" and Additional Levels

Complex Example:

5 Counts of Fraud OL 23 Robbery Ct. & Assault Ct. (of same victim)

OL 24 Robbery
OL 28

Assignment of Units (§3D1.4)

	Fraud Group OL 23	Robbery / Assault Group OL 24	Robbery Group OL 28
Assignment of Units	½ unit	1 unit	1 unit

Total Units 2½

Additional Offense Levels (§3D1.4)

Total of $2\frac{1}{2}$ units = 3 additional offense levels

28 (highest group (Robbery))

+ 3 additional offense levels

31 combined offense level

Multiple Counts and Acceptance of Responsibility

• Acceptance of responsibility is determined only <u>after</u> application of the guidelines for multiple counts has established a single combined adjusted offense level

• Acceptance (the reduction of 2 or 3 offense levels) is based upon consideration of <u>all</u> counts
